**ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO DETERMINE CONFIDENTIALITY OF
COURT RECORDS (VERIFIED COMPLAINT AND EX PARTE APPLICATION FOR
RECOGNITION AND ENFORCEMENT OF FOREIGN FREEZING INJUNCTION)**

THIS CAUSE came before the Court on Plaintiffs' *Motion to Determine Confidentiality of Court Records (Verified Complaint and Ex Parte Application for Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Freezing Injunction)* (the "**Motion**"). The Court having reviewed the Motion and being otherwise fully advised in the premises, it is hereby **ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** as follows:

1. The Motion is hereby **GRANTED**.
2. The Complaint [Filing No. 121262115] and Application [Filing No. 121298265] together with their Exhibits and this Court's Order Granting *Ex Parte* Expedited Application for Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Freezing Injunction dated February 16, 2021 shall be designated confidential and maintained under seal by the Clerk of the Court until further Order of the Court. Plaintiffs are directed to notify the Court promptly upon service of Defendants so that the seal may be lifted.

3. The court record or information in a court record is exempt from public access based on the following grounds:

a. To prevent a serious and imminent threat to the fair, impartial, and orderly administration of justice.

4. No party's name is determined to be confidential.

5. The progress docket or similar records generated to document activity in the case are not exempt from public access.

6. The confidential filings may be viewed by a judicial officer, general magistrate, hearing officer, and counsel of record.

7. The confidential filings referenced in this Order are exempt from public access until further court order. The degree, duration, and manner of exempting the court record from public access are no broader than necessary and there is no less restrictive measure to protect the interests of a party and the public.

8. The Clerk of the Courts shall post a copy of this Order on its website within ten (10) days of the date of this Order and it shall remain posted for a period of at least thirty (30) days.
